Privacy Notice for Parents and Carers Use of your child's personal data (child aged 12 or under)

Under data protection law, individuals have a right to be informed about how the school uses any personal data that we hold about them. We comply with this right by providing 'privacy notices' (sometimes called 'fair processing notices') to individuals where we are processing their personal data. This privacy notice explains how we collect, store and use personal data about pupils.

Peterborough Keys Academies Trust (PKAT) is the licensed 'data controller' for the purposes of data protection law. Longthorpe Primary School is an academy within PKAT and operates as a 'data processor' under the PKAT licence.

THE CATEGORIES OF PERSONAL DATA WE HOLD

Personal data that we may collect, use, store and share (when appropriate) about pupils includes, but is not restricted to:

- Personal Information (such as name, address, contact details, date of birth, identification documents, unique pupil number)
- Characteristics, such as ethnic background, eligibility for free school meals, or special educational needs
- Attendance information (such as sessions attended, number of absences and absence reasons, including extracurricular activities and previous school attendance)
- Special Education Needs (SEN) information
- Safeguarding information
- Details of any medical conditions, including physical and mental health
- National Curriculum Assessments/results
- Individual Assessment Data, tests and Reports
- Exclusion/behaviour information
- Details of any support received, including care packages, plans and support providers
- Schools they have attended previously and have joined after they leave us
- Pupil and curricular records
- Photographs

We may also hold data about pupils that we have received from other organisations, including other schools, local authorities and the Department for Education.

WHY WE USE THIS DATA

We use this data to:

- Support pupil learning
- Monitor and report on pupil progress
- Provide appropriate pastoral care
- Protect pupil welfare – including safeguarding pupils
- Assess the quality of our services
- Administer admissions waiting lists
- Carry out research
- Comply with the law regarding data sharing

OUR LEGAL BASIS FOR USING THIS DATA

Longthorpe Primary School holds the legal right to collect and use personal data relating to pupils and their families, in order to meet legal requirements set out in the GDPR and UK law, including those in relation to the following:

- Article 6 and Article 9 of the General Data Protection Regulations
- Education Act 1996
- Regulation 5 of The Education (Information About Individual Pupils) (England) Regulations 2013

Most commonly, we process it where:

- We need to comply with a legal obligation
- We need it to perform an official task in the public interest

Less commonly, we may also process pupils' personal data in situations where:

- We have obtained consent to use it in a certain way
- We need to protect the individual's vital interests (or someone else's interests)

COLLECTING THIS INFORMATION

Whilst the majority of pupil information you provide to us is mandatory, some of it is provided to us on a voluntary basis. In order to comply with the General Data Protection Regulation, we will inform you whether you are required to provide certain pupil information to us or if you have a choice in this.

HOW WE STORE THIS DATA

We keep personal information about pupils while they are attending our school and beyond their attendance at our school if this is necessary in order to comply with our legal obligations. Personal data is stored in line with our Data Protection Policy. In accordance with the GDPR, the school does not store personal data indefinitely. DATA SHARING

We do not share information about pupils with any third party without consent unless the law and our policies allow us to do so. Where it is legally required, or necessary (and it complies with data protection law) we may share personal information about pupils with:

- Our local authority – to meet our legal obligations to share certain information with it, such as safeguarding concerns and exclusions
- The Department for Education
- The pupil's family and representatives
- School to school networks
- Educators and examining bodies
- Our regulator/auditor, e.g. Ofsted, The Peterborough Keys Academies Trust (PKAT)
- Suppliers and service providers – to enable them to provide the service we have contracted them for
- The NHS, Health authorities, Physiotherapists, SALT, Occupational Therapists, Audiology, CAMHS, Cochlear Implant Teams etc
- Relevant Pupil Safeguarding bodies and social welfare organisations
- Professional advisers and consultants
- Police forces, courts, tribunals
- Professional bodies

WHY WE SHARE PUPIL INFORMATION

We do not share information about our pupils with anyone without consent unless the law and our policies allow us to do so. We share pupils' data with the Department for Education (DfE) on a statutory basis. This data sharing underpins school funding and educational attainment policy and monitoring.

We are required to share information about our pupils with our Local Authority (LA) and the Department for Education (DfE) under section 3 of The Education (Information About Individual Pupils) (England) Regulations 2013.

DATA COLLECTION REQUIREMENTS

THE NATIONAL PUPIL DATABASE (NPD)

We are required to provide information about pupils to the Department for Education (DfE) as part of statutory data collections such as the school census. Some of this information is then stored in the [National Pupil Database](#) (NPD), which is owned and managed by the DfE and provides evidence on school performance to inform research.

The database is held electronically so it can easily be analysed for statistics. The information is securely collected from a range of sources including schools, local authorities and exam boards. The Department for

Education may share information from the NPD with other organisations which promote children's education or wellbeing in England. Such organisations must agree to strict terms and conditions about how they will use the data.

TRANSFERRING DATA INTERNATIONALLY

Where we transfer personal data to a country or territory outside the European Economic Area, we will do so in accordance with data protection law.

PARENTS AND PUPILS' RIGHTS REGARDING PERSONAL DATA

Individuals have a right to make a 'Subject Access Request' to gain access to personal information that the school holds about them. Parents/carers can make a request with respect to their child's data where the child is not considered mature enough to understand their rights over their own data (usually under the age of 12), or where the child has provided consent.

Individuals also have the right for their personal information to be transmitted electronically to another organisation in certain circumstances. If you would like to make a request please contact our data protection officer.

You also have the right to:

- object to processing of personal data that is likely to cause, or is causing, damage or distress
- prevent processing for the purpose of direct marketing
- object to decisions being taken by automated means
- in certain circumstances, have inaccurate personal data rectified, blocked, erased or destroyed; and
- claim compensation for damages caused by a breach of the Data Protection regulations
