

Book Challenge Tasks – Years 3&4



How will you know I've read a book?

You will need to show that you have read each book for your teacher to stamp your passport. There are lots of different ways you can show this, some ideas are below, but you are welcome to come up with your own ideas too. Make sure you choose different ways to show you have read different books.

-  Pick a character from your text. Draw a picture of them and write words around them, describing their appearance, personality and name.
-  A) Where is the setting for this text (where it takes place)? List them if there is more than one. B) Pick one setting and using your own words and the words from the text, describe it. Use adjectives or add sentences.
-  Find 10 verbs (action words) from the text. Put them in alphabetical order and find a synonym (a word that has a similar meaning) to go with it.
-  Which character would you choose as a friend? Why? Which character wouldn't you choose as a friend? Why not?
-  What words does the author use for said? List them.
-  List or draw the main events in the story, but you can only tell me in 8 bullet points/pictures or less.
-  Complete the sentence about how you felt throughout the book. Your feelings may change as the story progresses, so use more than one sentence to describe this; I felt... when...
-  Most authors use 'and' to connect sentences. How many different connectives/conjunctions did your author use? List them.
-  List the vocabulary you needed to clarify

-  Make a crossword or wordsearch with some of the vocabulary you learnt
-  Write a glossary for the any words that may be tricky for others
-  Make a comic strip of one of the events in the book
-  Dress up as one of the characters and send in a photo of you as them
-  Tell your teacher what you liked about the book
-  Write a new blurb for the book
-  Design a new book cover
-  Take a picture of you reading the book and send it to your teacher on Seesaw
