

Book Challenge Tasks – Years 5&6



How will you know I've read a book?

You will need to show that you have read each book for your teacher to stamp your passport. There are lots of different ways you can show this, some ideas are below, but you are welcome to come up with your own ideas too. Make sure you choose different ways to show you have read different books.

- 📖 A) Where is the setting for this text (where it takes place)? List them if there is more than one. B) Pick one setting and using your own words and the words from the text, describe it. Use relative clauses, rhetorical questions, metaphors etc.
- 📖 Prequel – What happened the day before this story happened? Try to write in a similar style to the author.
- 📖 Sentences can start with phrases that tell us when, where, who, what & how E.g. That evening (when). Try to find at least one example for each phrase type.
- 📖 Take a picture of you reading the book and send it to your teacher on Seesaw
- 📖 Summarise the story in no more than 5 points
- 📖 Write a recommendation for the book – How many stars would you give it? Who might like to read it?
- 📖 If your character was writing a text message to another character, what would they say?
- 📖 What would the newspaper report headline be if the story was made into a newspaper report?
- 📖 List the vocabulary you needed to clarify
- 📖 Make a crossword or wordsearch with some of the vocabulary you learnt

-  Write a glossary for the any words that may be tricky for others
-  Make a comic strip of one of the events in the book
-  Dress up as one of the characters and send in a photo of you as them
-  Tell your teacher what you liked about the book
-  Write a new blurb for the book
-  Design a new book cover
-  What could happen next? Try to write the next paragraph, chapter or adventure for one of the characters.
