Dear Parents / Carers

What a privilege it was to attend the great adventure to Snowdonia with Year 6 children and the staff! The children were in awe of the landscape and challenged themselves throughout the week to overcome fears. They were also enabled to develop their resilience and independence at the centre, where they had to carry out various duties, such as, making their own beds, keeping their rooms tidy, setting the dining tables and clearing the mess up afterwards - it really was great to see them all muck in and look after each other. As well as this, they had to take personal responsibility for organising their kit before and after activities, which included rock climbing, mining (where the children experienced complete darkness), gorge walking, canoeing and other exciting activities. I do hope the children have managed to apply their new learnt skills at home and you now have an extra pair of willing, helping hands around the home.

I would like to take the opportunity, and I am sure you will join me, to thank all the staff who gave up time away from their own loved ones and worked around the clock from Sunday to Friday, to ensure your children could experience this great opportunity - I hope it is one they never forget! THANK YOU Mrs Theakstone / Mrs Farrow and a special mention for Ms Green, who attended the full week and organised the whole trip!

The Snowdon residential is a unique opportunity for our children in Year 6, which we have been running for 6 years now and hope to continue to run annually. We want as many children from each Year 6 cohort to attend as possible, so for future Year 6 parents please bear this in mind. We appreciate there is a cost to it, which we try to subsidise to keep as low as we can. The cost includes:

- Transport to and from Blue Peris
- Transport to and from activities
- Experienced instructors who are highly qualified and lead international expeditions and mountain rescue
- Round the clock care for your children (thanks Longthorpe staff!)
- 4 full days of adventurous activities
- Food and board for the week
- Essential clothing, including, fleeces, waterproofs, helmets, wellies and climbing shoes.
- A range of adventurous activities

A truly AMAZING adventure in a superb natural environment for your children! I cannot stress how important we feel this experience is for your children and it is such great value for money too! Compared with other providers, such as PGL, a visit to an artificial environment where they cannot replicate Snowdonia, from Monday to Friday (3 days of activity, with no clothing provided) would cost approximately £450 (this does not include coach travel costs). We are currently taking sign up from Year 5 for next year's visit - please sign your children up if you can.

I hope you found the open evenings held in school this week helpful and informative. Thanks to all the staff for their hard work in organising this and to everyone who attended.


